LITERACY & CHURCH PLANTING

The Asháninka, over 100,000 souls scattered throughout the Peruvian rainforests, live on the outside of the modern world. Their daily focus is survival, leaving little room for other pursuits.

THE GOOD:

Indigenous communities are gradually embracing the outside world, welcoming education and new beliefs. Asháninka's radio access enables remote ministries such as Christian radio programs.

THE BAD:

Existing Christians compromise their testimony through syncretic faith and immoral behavior. The prevalent illiteracy hinders Bible access, while limited medical services add to the challenges they face.

OUR APPROACH:

Missionaries prioritize three key areas: ① nurturing the local church and promoting literacy, ② broadcasting Christian radio programs, ③ expanding the missionary base with a medical and training center to provide healthcare and equip believers for church planting.



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
